Teenagers love the 3D thrill of IMAX, kids never forget a 'flight' on the London Eye, and toddlers adore the free space of Tate Modern's Turbine Hall and the Millennium Bridge, but the stretch south of the Thames running between Lambeth and London Bridges has so much more to offer under-18s - and that's before you even get on to the river itself... From theatre workshops for teenagers to the chance for three-year-olds to sample their first dim sum. from free live music to interactive outdoor art. the whole family can enjoy the ever-changing programme of entertainment that South Bank and Bankside have to offer throughout the year.

10am Take the first 'flight' of the day on the London Eye, before the riverside gets really busy. 10.45am Juice on the Festival Terrace in front of the Royal Festival Hall. 11am Explore the gigantic installations of The Havward's 'Walking in my Mind' exhibition (June 23-Sept 9). In the summer months get soaked in the fountains of Jeppe Hein's 'Appearing Rooms' water sculpture on Riverside Terrace at the Royal Festival Hall. 12.30pm Lunch at one of the many cafés and restaurants on the South



Bank, or bring a picnic to enjoy by the river. **2.15pm** Take the London Eye River Cruise from the Millennium Pier down the Thames, for 40 minutes of relaxation and a live commentary taking in London sights including



Big Ben and St Paul's. Or take a stroll among the fish through the amazing new glass walkway at the SEA LIFE London Aquarium. **4pm** A ride on the Golden Carousel (by the Golden Jubilee Bridges) and an ice cream to end the day.

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HOLIDAY WORKSHOPS AND COURSES

At the Florence Nightingale Museum (right) find out how to use chocolate as a cure at Easter holiday drop-in sessions (until April 10: free with entry). During halfterm (May 23-31) kids can create a family portrait here. At Topolski Century (right) kids of all ages can join Easter Animal Hunt drawing workshops, April 7-19. Tate Modern (below) runs a free fortnightly workshop on Fridays called 'We Are All Experts' for ages 15-23 (5-7pm, June 5-July 31, meet on Level 3 concourse). The Golden Hinde (below) has holiday workshops for 5-11s, such as a two-hour Maritime Workshop (Apr 7 & 14. May 26 & 28, £8.50) about Drake and life on board the galleon. Explore Bankside

A day of funky art, gory history and great food in London's Elizabethan quarter



9am Borough Market. 10am Spot the art: look for works curated by young people (working with the Street Genius project). Find 'In Situ' outside the Jerwood Space at 171 Union Street, and then walk to the 'Smarties' light sculpture under the bridge on Southwark Street. 12noon Lunch break: buy takeaway sarnies, salads, pasta or sushi from the many places at Bankside Mix (on and behind Southwark Street) and eat them on the stone benches there.

1pm In Sumner Street. by the Blue Fin Building, check out animatronic statue 'Monument to the Unknown Artist', which



mimics your movements. 1.30pm Find the Ferryman's Seat in Bear Gardens, where ferrymen once waited for fares.

2pm Kids who like gore will enjoy the London Bridge Experience. Under-8s can play pirates on the Golden Hinde.

4pm See funky new art at the Novas Contemporary Urban Centre (73 Southwark Bridge Rd. SE1 0NQ, 020 7403 8495) or check out Tate Modern's art activities. 5pm End with a sweet treat from Southwark Cathedral Refectory.

Places to visit **Rankside**

Big in Elizabethan times, experience the modern buzz of this ancient area

Golden Hinde Age 5-11

This replica of Sir Francis Drake's 16th-century ship is a delight. There's plenty of nautical fun to be had: for an unforgettable experience, book the family on a summer sleepover (£39.99 per person) or have a party there. 

South Bank

There are lots of places to eat here. Canteen (Southbank Centre Square. Belvedere Rd. SE1 8XX. 0845 686 1122) serves British fare, while the terrace in front of the Royal Festival Hall has Giraffe (Festival Riverside. SE1 8XX, 020 7928 2004) with global food and a kids' menu, and Strada (Festival Riverside. SE1 8XX, 020 7401 9126) for pasta and pizza. Try dim sum at Ping Pong



(Festival Terrace, SE1 8XX, 020 7960 4160) or enjoy hot food or sarnies at benugo@BFI (Belvedere Rd, SE1 8XT, 020 7401 9000), with a kids' menu.





At Gabriel's Wharf (56 Upper Ground, SE1 9PP). there's The Gourmet Pizza Co (020 7928 3188). House of Crepes (020 7401 9816) and Mediterranean restaurant Riviera (020 7401 7314). In the Oxo Tower itself (Barge House St. SE1 9PH), you have Caffè Alba with panini and ice creams or, for a real treat, the OXO Tower Restaurant (020 7803 3888) with its river views. The Young Vic does good food, too (66 The Cut, SE1 8LZ. 020 7928 4400).

Bankside

Foodie heaven **Borough Market** has become a top tourist destination. On Saturdays it gets too crammed to negotiate by 11am, but if you arrive at 9am when stalls open you can pick up some tasty treats. There are family-friendly options in the area

Wagamama noodle bar (1 Clink St, SE1 9BU, 020 7403 3659). Nando's (215-217 Clink St. SE1 9DG, 020 7357 8662) and a Pizza Express on the river (Bankside, SE1 9DS, 020 7401 3977). If you have fidgety children, try the speedy and informal Leon (7 Canvey St. SE1 9AN, 020 7620 0035). or The Table (88 Southwark St. SE1 0HX. 020 7401 2760) for soups and risottos. The superb Café 2 at Tate Modern (Bankside, SE1 9TG, 020 7401 5014), has a junior menu and crayons (look out for 'kids eat free' deals at the Tate's restaurants). Or Southwark Cathedral Refectory (London Bridge, SE1 9DA, 020 7407 5740) has soups,

Beach All ages

When the tide is out, there are spots where you can get on to the 'beach' and even make sand sculptures! The best stretch is in front of Gabriel's Wharf and Oxo Tower Wharf, but check tide times first (www.pla.co.uk).

London RIB Voyages All ages

Great for teens, this high-speed 50-minute round trip from the Eye to Canary Wharf is an exciting zip down the river in true James Bond style.

Mudlarking Age 5+ (with an adult)
