The ROYAL OASIS

Experience an afternoon fit for royalty this summer, exploring Buckingham Palace Garden and enjouing a picnic on the lawn



he glorious garden at Buckingham Palace will he open to visitors from July to September this year allowing the grounds of Her Majesty The Queen's official London residence to be explored with unprecedented freedom for the first time.

Visitors will be free to explore a route through the garden that encompasses the 156-metre Herbaceous Border, plane trees planted by and named after Queen Victoria and Prince Albert and views of the island and its beehives across the 3.5-

acre lake. The unique opportunity to enjoy a picnic on one of the sweeping lawns overlooking the Palace will also be part of the visit.

Additional features in the south-west of the garden. including the Rose Garden. summer house and wildflower meadow, can be viewed through one of the many guided tours that will run each day.

CELEBRATORY EVENTS

Buckingham Palace's 39-acre garden fulfils many roles. It is The Queen's private London garden, but it also plays a key part in the busy calendar of royal events. The most famous of these events are The Queen's Garden Parties, which in an

average year see around 24,000 guests from all walks of life welcomed into the garden each summer. For more than 200 years, the garden has been used by the Royal Family for official entertaining and celebratory events.

NATURAL HARITAT

Described as 'a walled oasis in the middle of London', it is the largest private garden in the capital and boasts 325 wild-plant species, 30 species of breeding birds, and more than 1,000 trees, including 98 plane trees, 85 species of oak and the National Collection of Mulberry Trees.

The garden also provides a habitat for native birds rarely seen in London, including >

◀ the common sandpiper. sedge warbler and lesser whitethroat, some of which use the area around its central lake as a nesting site

Other areas of the garden include the 156-metre Herbaceous Border, wildflower meadow and Rose Garden. Structures in the garden include a wisteria-clad summer house, the enormous

Waterloo Vase made for George IV in Italy, and the Palace tennis court, where King George VI and Fred Perry played in the 1930s.

Hourly short talks will give further information about the history of the garden. Visitors can also learn more by reading the beautiful new book that follows a year in the life of the roval garden at Buckingham

Palace. Gardening insights and tips from Head Gardener. Mark Lane, are presented alongside atmospheric photography and an authoritative text, including royal anecdotes. trip to a royal palace is a must for any visitor and fashion lovers really shouldn't miss Royal Style in the Making in the newly-conserved historic Orangery at Kensington Palace. The exhibition explores the intimate relationship between fashion designers and their royal clients. The biggest draw is sure to be Princess Diana's iconic wedding dress. On loan from HRH The Duke of Cambridge and the Duke of Sussex and on display for the first time in 25 years. Another piece of fashion history featured is the rare surviving toile for the 1937 coronation gown of Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother, consort of King George VI. Glittering gowns, stylish tailoring and some surprises all await fashion fans.

A day trip to Windsor Castle is always recommended, but may be of particular interest to those with a passion for sport. science, conservation and art.

A special display, Prince Philip: A Celebration.

commemorates the life and legacy of His Royal Highness, Britain's longestserving consort.

Exploring his early life and naval career, his role as consort and his support

for Her Royal Highness The Queen. There is also a focus on his wide-ranging patronages and associations, including sport, science and industry, conservation and the environment, art and collecting, and much more. Selected highlights include the Midshipman's Log Book

which he updated while aboard the HMS Valiant, and The Coronation Robe and Coronet he wore during Her Majesty The Queen's Coronation on 2 June 1953 (until 20 Sep).



The making of a master

t's been a long year without our favourite museums and galleries. Now their doors are open, they are certainly delivering on entertainment. There are some huge. blockbuster exhibitions to catch this summer. showcasing the very best of art, history, and so much more.

Considered by many to be the founder of modern sculpture, Auguste Rodin is best known for his bronze and marble sculptures. You've probably heard of The Thinker, arguably his most famous artwork.

In collaboration with Musée Rodin, Tate Modern has been granted unprecedented access to more than 200 works that have not been seen outside of France before. The EYExhibition: The Making of Rodin (to 21 Nov) is the first major exhibition to focus on Rodin's use of plaster, which he used along with clay to capture

movement, light and volume, Casts in all sizes are on display and demonstrate his constant experimentation with plaster. Some of his best-known works were influenced by this process, including The Burghers of Calais, which you can see at the exhibition in the form of the newly restored original plaster.

The atmosphere of the artist's studio is also considered, as well as the dynamics between the artist and his models and collaborators. including fellow sculptor Camille Claudel, the Japanese actress Ohta Hisa, and the German aristocrat Helene Von Nostitz.

A collection of experimental works reveals a new side to the sculptor and offers a rare insight into the master's process. This is an unrivalled opportunity to explore Rodin like you've never seen him before. Booking is essential and tickets cost £18 or are free for members.



Congestion and Ultra Low Emission **Zone Charges**

The central London Congestion Charge is temporarily operating 7am-10pm every day of the year, except Christmas Day (25 December). Pay in advance or on the day (£15) or by midnight, three days after the day you travelled (£17.50). The Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ) operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, every day of the year (except Christmas Day). It covers the same area as the Congestion Charge zone until 25 October 2021 when it expands up to, but not including, the North and South circular roads. Cars, motorcycles, vans and other specialist vehicles (up to and including 3.5 tonnes), and minibuses (up to and including 5 tonnes) will either need to meet the ULEZ emissions standards, or pay a £12.50 daily charge when driving within the ULEZ zone, T: 0343-222 2222 www.cclondon.com













London bus map




